## Hyperbilirubinemia Management of Indirect Neonatal ...

Feeding supplementation is not indicated for sleepy neonates during first 24-48 hours, unless signs of dehydration, or weight loss more than the 95th percentile per the newborn weight tool (NEWT). Feeding recommendations are not relevant if a patient is critically ill and enteral feeds are being withheld. Diagnosis.

Discharge Feeding Guidelines Infant at birth 2.5kg: Can be discharge home exclusively breast feeding and breast milk If formula supplementation is required, can be on term infant formula Will need polyvisol or D- visol for additional 400 IU Vitamin D/per day for bone growth.

## Total Parenteral Nutrition

Reduce IV lipid by 50% when infant tolerates 100ml/kg/day of enteral feed. Cease lipids when infant tolerates 120ml/kg/day of enteral feeds. Components of TPN Fluid Volumes are increased over the first 7 days in line with the feeding protocol with the aim of delivering 150 ml/kg/day by day 7. Day 1 60 ml/kg/day Day 2-3 90 ml/kg /day Day 4-6 120 ...

enteral). The most important aspect of treating re-feeding syndrome is recognising those who are at risk. Any child/adolescent requiring intensive re-feeding will be at risk of re-feeding syndrome. Treatment should be managed accordingly, with education for the child/adolescent/family about re-feeding options (oral/NG).
